

My Visit Programs:

Programs can be designed for either small groups (1-2 classes) or larger multi-class presentations.



Authors, Illustrators, and Secret Helpers

Perfect for: grades K-1

Kindergartners and first graders are already learning about the role the author and illustrator play in bringing a story to life. I tell kids about the two secret, invisible people who also shape a book - the editor and art director. I'll show how I make decisions about creating an illustration with examples from my own books. Finally I let the kids become the art directors! A few kids are chosen to give me details of a monster and then I illustrate it for the whole class to see.

Illustrate This!

Perfect for: grades 1-4

Early elementary grades are learning how to describe and explain a text by the clues in the illustrations. I'll show the kids an overview of my illustration process and how I choose certain details such as color, angle, and character expression to convey the story. At the end the students become illustrators! I give them each a piece of the story and they illustrate the main idea using the details we talked about.



A Path for Emerging Artists

Perfect for: Middle and High school students interested in sequential art as a career.

Many middle and high school students dream of art as their path to college and career. Some may not think it's possible. I'll tell my story of becoming an illustrator and cite my love of reading for making it happen. At the end we'll do a Q&A period where the students can ask me anything. Longer workshops include an "Illustrate This" project and class critique.
